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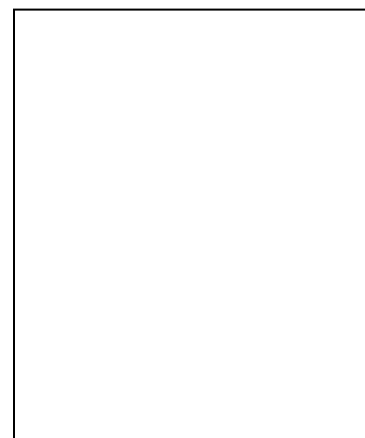

- ❖ I, the undersigned, declare all the above information to be truthful and accurate.
- ❖ I understand that I will work under the authority of EWCV and I will submit to the authority at the project.
- ❖ As a volunteer in EWCV's ministry, I do hereby, discharge all rights and claims for injury or illness (including death) whether physically or emotional, or property damage or loss of any nature, which I may have or which hereafter accrue to me against EWCV's ministry, for any and all damages and liabilities which may be sustained and suffered by me in connection with my association with and/or arising out of my traveling to, participating with, and returning from any of the work, activities and services of EWCV's ministries.
- ❖ I understand that during my stay abroad as a volunteer, I am not allowed to become boyfriend/girlfriend with a child (defined as 0-18 years of age), and/or in any way engage in a sexual relationship with any anyone (outside marriage) during my stay in Uganda.
- ❖ I understand that all finances and all insurances are entirely my own responsibility during my stay abroad, and that EWCV where I will volunteer cannot be held responsible for any loss or lost in this matter. I understand that I will work as an unpaid volunteer and I will cover all expenses myself. The cost of accommodations/food, for transport to and from the airport, and for transport to and from the EWCV property at Lubumba from Masaka will be calculated for you when the dates of your arrival and departure are known.
- ❖ I understand that during my time as volunteer, I'm not allowed take any narcotic drugs, drink alcoholic beverages, or smoke and I agree to follow the ministry's specific guidelines in those matters.
- ❖ I understand and agree to abide by the following Volunteer-Staff Communications policy.

Volunteer - Staff Communications

Volunteers spending time with the staff and children of EWCV are not to give out any of personal information such as their mailing address, phone numbers, or email addresses to anyone.

If volunteers wish to communicate with staff members after departure, this correspondence is to be done through the Directors and office of EWCV who will forward and retrieve messages for the volunteers.

If volunteers are asked for personal information, they are required to tell people that they can be contacted through the EWCV Directors.

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If volunteers become close friends with some of the staff members, the volunteers should not make promises to support them with further education, provide them with money directly, or bring them sometime to Canada or elsewhere in the world, without first having spoken to the Directors. Any such wishes of volunteers to assist people need to be discussed with the Directors. If promises are made and then cannot be kept, the hopes of the people left behind will be disappointed.

Volunteers come for relatively short periods of time. They therefore need to be guided in their communications with EWCV staff and friends outside EWCV by the Directors who are here for the long term and are responsible for dealing with the multitude of things involved in running the organization. The volunteers need at all times to keep the leaders of EWCV informed of their programs with the organization as well as planning initially what they are to do. Any further programs outside of EWCV need to be discussed and approved by the leaders of EWCV before proceeding with plans unknown to the leaders.

EWCV has a dress code for Volunteers to follow which is meant to show respect to the local people who are not always used to seeing some of the Western style of clothing that may be the norm back home. When the volunteer has made decisions about definitely coming to EWCV then they can ask about the dress code to help them know what items to pack for their work here.

Volunteers should always ask about any gift items they may wish to bring for the children as to what might be appropriate.

This communications policy is in place at EWCV, as it is in many NGO's, so that misunderstandings due to cultural differences or unforeseen circumstances are avoided.
